



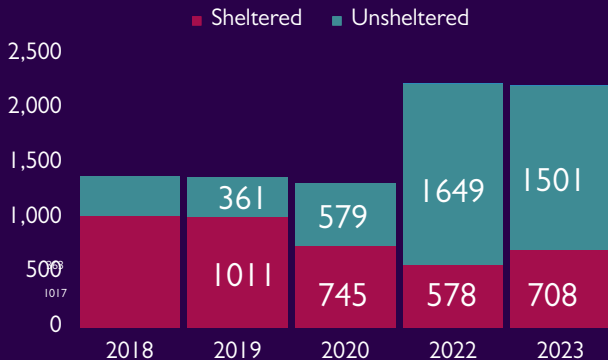

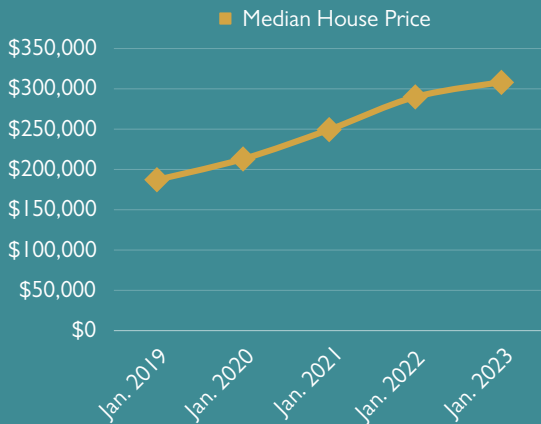

# For many Tucsonans, securing safe, affordable housing is increasingly unobtainable.



The 2023 Point in Time Homeless Count rose 60 percent in Pima County in the last five years.

- Median sale price of a home in Tucson (Oct. 2023): \$325,000
- Median income needed for affordable housing in Tucson: \$101,268
- Median income Tucson: \$48,058





At Primavera, our mission is to make opportunities available for people who are struggling with poverty. We provide options such as safe, affordable housing, workforce development, and neighborhood revitalization.

Consider Michael Pulaski, who arrived in Tucson from the Midwest. Pulaski, 64, served in the United States Marine Corps. He was referred to Primavera's Project Action for Veterans by the VA in July 2022 and was housed by August.

The former cabinet maker said he had been homeless for about three years after debilitating pain in his knees led to an opioid dependence.

Senior Resource Specialist Josefina Torres with Project Action for Veterans helped him secure a home in just two weeks. He said he never imagined that kind of help could happen so fast.

"She basically saved my life," Pulaski said.

## Primavera Foundation serves more than 8,000 families, individuals, and veterans each year.

- We provide emergency shelter and resources through an 80-bed men's shelter, a women's shelter, a scattered-site family shelter and two drop-in centers for daily assistance.
- We operate 11 properties with 145 units that provide residents safe, affordable housing.
- Primavera Works, our temporary staffing agency, assists 300 to 400 participants each year through temporary employment at a living wage (\$16.50/hour currently) and assistance in their permanent job search (resume building, goal-setting, overcoming a prior conviction, etc.).
- We offer an array of homeownership and financial education classes and workshops in both English and Spanish.
- In the 2021 and 2022 fiscal years, more than 3,000 people used (and continue to use) a mail service established at our Resource Center (702 S. Sixth Ave.). The mail program serves an essential service for unhoused or transitional people who would otherwise not have access to receiving mail.
- Our Project Action for Veterans program served 744 veterans in fiscal years 2020-21 and helped 184 veteran families avoid homelessness through preventative strategies.

As we celebrate 40 years of service in and with  
community, we are grateful for you.
