



A Continuing Cultural Education Program for Pastors and Church Leaders

The **Minnery Fellowship for Cultural Engagement** is an ongoing Continuing Cultural Education program to provide opportunities for pastors and elders to dive into the practical issues facing Christians in culture and develop, with a cohort of their peers, biblical strategies and messages to respond.

The Columbus cohort will begin monthly meetings on Friday, January 24, from 8:30 to 10:30 am, at 58 Partners Renewal Center (4500 Dublin Rd. SPC 471, Columbus, OH 43221). The deadline to apply for the Minnery Fellowship Columbus cohort is Tuesday, December 31.



Dr. Jim Spiegel, Executive Director of the Kalos Center for Christian Education and Spiritual Formation, will serve as the Columbus cohort facilitator. He taught philosophy and religion at Taylor University for 27 years and is currently the John Templeton Research Fellow at Hillsdale College. He has authored or edited 11 books, and published over 100 articles and book chapters,

 $mainly \ on \ issues \ in \ philosophy \ of \ religion, \ philosophical \ theology, \ and \ ethics.$

How much does the Minnery Fellowship cost?
